

Tropical Flowers - Sashiko Sampler Workshop With Sylvia Pippen

Choose one of #9 exotic flowers:

Easiest: Plumeria, Hibiscus, Anthurium, Moth Orchid

Moderate: Angel Trumpet, Ginger

More difficult: Lotus, Heliconia, Bird of Paradise

Discover how to fussy cut fabric to give your flowers dimension. Try out my favorite press-over heat resistant Mylar method to pre-form shapes ready to appliqué. Learn how to easily transfer your design onto dark fabric and sashiko techniques.

Supply List

- Optional: ***Paradise Stitched*** by Sylvia Pippen. Read chapters on Sashiko, appliqué, and fabric selection for a head start.
- Small sharp pointed cloth and paper scissors
- Thimble
- Applique pins & needles
- Baste-it fabric glue
- White transfer paper
- Appliqué thread
- Packet of Clover small to medium assorted sashiko needles or any strong needle with a sharp point and big eye
- Sashiko thread white or light green or Perle cotton #5
- Thread conditioner: Thread heaven or beeswax
- Fine line permanent black marking pen, white chalk pencil, ball point pen
- Hobbico or other small craft iron such as Clover mini-iron
- Tabletop firm small ironing board
- Spray starch and paper towels

Fabrics

- 1/2 yd. of indigo or other dark color for background
- A large variety of batiks and other cotton fabrics for appliqué. Look at your individual flower pattern for fabric selection suggestions.

Optional: Fabric kits available for: \$35

Kits include: Pattern, background and appliqué fabric, Mylar, sashiko thread, and transfer paper
