### **Fabulous Fat Quarter Bag**

Finished: 19" x 21 1/2"

The Fat-Quarter Tote Bag offers creative opportunities that include machine embroidery, buttons, tassels, and prairie points, yet it goes together so easily, you can make one up quickly to give as a last-minute gift. I've made many versions and especially like featuring my fabric collections! It's perfect for tucking into your suitcase to bring home those souvenirs!

### **Materials for the Basic Bag**

*Unless noted otherwise, yardage is based on fabric that measures 42"-wide.  
A fat quarter assumes fabric that measures 17 1/2" x 20" after laundering.*

Bag Body and Handle: 6 assorted fat quarters

Lining: 1 3/8 yards

Thin batting or diaper flannel: 1 3/8 yards

Decorative buttons: 2

Matching and/or contrasting threads for machine topstitching and/or quilting

Decorative thread for handle (optional)

Medium to heavyweight iron-on stabilizer: 1/4 yard (40"-wide)

Embroidery floss: 22 packages for tassels or 2 purchased tassels in coordinating colors

If you want an embroidery on the pockets, please have this prepared for class!

### **Additional Supplies**

A sewing machine in good working order

Fine pins with glass heads

100% cotton thread

Scissors and a seam ripper

Rotary Equipment: cutter, cutting mat, & rulers

Any tool that helps you see the value of fabric; my preference is a 'peep hole', found in most hardware stores
